



## Axiomatic Conflict Minerals Policy

The term “**Conflict minerals**” refers specifically to the minerals Gold(Au), Tin(Sn), Tungsten(W), and Tantalum(Ta) mined in the Democratic Republic of the Congo and bordering states. Mining profits in this area are reportedly used to finance armed conflict and human rights abuses. Many national governments and companies, including Axiomatic, are implementing policies and practices to avoid contributing to the problem.

Axiomatic manufactures electronic assemblies and uses tin in its processes, as well as purchases parts that may include gold, tin, tungsten, and tantalum.

Axiomatic has a corporate policy that it does not buy or use any conflict minerals in its products. Furthermore, Axiomatic asks its suppliers to certify that they do not buy or use conflict minerals in products supplied to us.

Axiomatic does not purchase any of these materials directly from mines or smelters. We furthermore ask our suppliers to obtain information on their sources, using the CFSI Conflict Minerals Reporting Template.

Axiomatic supports the Conflict free Minerals initiative (Dodd-Franks Act). Axiomatic does not knowingly use any minerals originating from conflict mines or smelters.
